



### Karnley, Amos

I am Amos K. Karnley. I was born on January 6, 1962 in a small village called Gbaisumon, now Manor Clan. My parents are Mr. Momo and Mrs. Maima Karnley.

In 1982 I went to Monrovia to start Senior High School. I graduated from Boatswain High School in 1985. I returned to Tubmanburg. Since graduation from high school I have been working as a trained government teacher in schools.

When the civil war hit Tubmanburg I fled to Monrovia. It was also during that time I had an opportunity to attend the Maranatha Bible College of Theology. I am presently a senior student of said institution.

I became a member of the United Pentecostal Church of Liberia during my first displacement in 1995. I was baptized in that church in 1996. When the fighting died down I returned to Tubmanburg. The church went through a 3 day fast and prayer for a revival service that brought together all UPC churches in Tubmanburg and surrounding towns. During the third night of this great revival, God filled me with the Holy Ghost.

In 1998 I received my first Gospel Worker License and was assigned to Hill Top Preaching Point in Munbah village. Two years later, I received local license. I was transferred from Hill Top Preaching Point to Beafinie UPC. While in Beafinie I was assigned to New Road, Tubmanburg to revive the Golahun UPC. This church is now in active worship with a membership of twenty adults and twenty three children.
